DO HEREBY RESOLVE:
 DÉCIDE, PAR LES PRÉSENTES: To establish the following anti-noise by-law: #8

- In this by-law; "Person" shall include a corporation and the heirs, executors, administrators or other legal representatives of a person to whom the context can apply according to the law.
- No person shall cause any unusual noise, shout or cause any noise likely to disturb the inhabitants within the St. Regis Indian Reserve Number 5 in the Province of Quebec and of the Cornwall Island Reserve Number 59 in the Province of Ontario.
- "No person shall use a snowmobile within the said Reserve lands between the hours of 9 o'clock in the afternoon until 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the day next following."
- No person shall use a motor vehicle horn or other horn any more than is reasonably necessary for safety and warning of other traffic or pedestrians.
- Any person found violating any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one Hundred Dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.

ANTI-NOISE BY-LAW #8

15TH OCTOBER 1971

By-law passed by Council Oct. 15 1971

Passed by Ministry of Indian Affairs on Nov. 23, 1971

BY-LAW PROHIBITING SHOUTING AND UNUSUAL NOISES OR NOISES LIKELY TO DISTURB THE INHABITANTS OF THE ST. REGIS INDIAN RESERVE NUMBER 15 IN THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC AND OF THE CORNWALL ISLAND RESERVE 59 IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

The Council of the Iroquois of St. Regis Band of Indian at a meeting held October 15, 1971 makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraphs (b) (c) (m) and (r) Section 80 of the Indian Act.

1. In this by-law:

“Person” shall include a corporation and the heirs, executors, administrators or other legal representatives of a person to whom the context can apply according to the law.

2. No person shall cause any unusual noise, shout or cause any noise likely to disturb the inhabitants within the St. Regis Indian Reserve Number 15 in the Province of Quebec and of the Cornwall Island Reserve Number 59 in the Province of Quebec.

3. “No person shall use a snowmobile within the said Reserve lands between the hours of 9 o’clock in the afternoon until 8 o’clock in the forenoon of the day next following.”

4. No person shall use a motor vehicle horn or other horn any more than is reasonably necessary for safety and warning of other traffic or pedestrians.

5. Any person found violating any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one Hundred Dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.
