# BORDER CROSSING GUIDE

WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT CROSSING AT THE CBSA PORT OF ENTRY IN CORNWALL

Canada

## **BEFORE YOU CROSS**

Prior to crossing at the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) Port of Entry (POE) in Cornwall, travellers must pass through a toll booth. This international toll bridge system is operated independently from the CBSA and managed by the Seaway International Bridge Corporation, Ltd. (SIBC).

SIBC collects tolls for those crossing the South Channel Bridge as a way to maintain this vital transportation route.

Due to the location of the toll booth, Akwesasronon are entitled to free passage across the bridge system. Community members can acquire a bridge pass at the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne's Office of Vital Statistics. OVS can be contacted at 613-575-2250 ext. 1013 or ovsclerk@akwesasne.ca.

## HOW DO I CROSS?

Because of the location of CBSA's POE in Cornwall, domestic and international travellers must present themselves at the POE. Once you pass through the toll booth, you can then proceed to any open lane at the POE and wait your turn.

**Domestic** travellers arrive/return from Kawehno:ke (Cornwall Island) and can use the domestic lane. Learn more about MCA & CBSA's Domestic Lane Pilot Project by scanning the QR code located in the back of the pamphlet.



**International** travellers arrive from or must travel through the United States, including travellers from Kana:takon (St. Regis, QC) and Tsi Snaihne (Snye, QC).

In preparation for crossing, please have all required identification and travel documents prepared. A Border Services Officer (BSO) will ask travellers where they are arriving from; additional questions may vary between domestic & international travellers.



## WHAT DO I DECLARE?

When arriving or returning to Canada you must, by Canadian law, report to a BSO, answer all questions truthfully, and accurately report your goods.

In accordance with the Akwesasne Residents Remission Order, Akwesasronon have the right to bring personal goods into Canada from the U.S. without having to pay duty or custom tariffs. This Remission Order <u>only</u> applies to the Cornwall Port of Entry, not to any other CBSA crossing or point of entry. ### WHAT IDENTIFICATION IS ACCEPTED?

You must carry identification for yourself and any children travelling with you. This is to help confirm your legal right or authorization to enter Canada when you arrive.

#### **MOHAWKS OF AKWESASNE**

Accepted identification for Akwesasronon includes Canadian or U.S. passport, a Canadian or U.S. birth certificate (*in addition to photo ID*), NEXUS card, a Secure Certificate of Indian Status, a Certificate of Indian Status (from the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne), or a tribal ID card (from the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe).



#### **CANADIAN CITIZENS**

Accepted identification includes a Canadian passport, a Canadian birth certificate (*in addition to photo ID*), a citizenship card, NEXUS card, FAST card, a Secure Certificate of Indian Status, or a Certificate of Indian Status (from the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne).

#### **U.S. CITIZENS**

If you are a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, you must carry proof of citizenship such as a passport, birth certificate (*in addition to photo ID*), a certificate of citizenship or naturalization, a U.S. Permanent Resident Card, or a tribal enrolment/identification card. Cards for trusted travellers programs, like NEXUS and FAST, will also be accepted.
