On the same day, commencing at 11:05 a.m. local time, the tenders will be opened and read publicly at the Cornwall Island Administration Office #3 on Cornwall Island.

Project description and work includes: Clearing and grubbing approximately of 0.2 hectares of wooded area around Tsi Snaihne School for the proposed walking path, and approx. of 721m of a stone dust walking path, 100mm stone dust base, 150mm Granular A' subbase, non-woven geotechnical fabric, and culvert and swale installation at low points of pathway. Removal and reinstatement of select concrete sidewalk panels at the Tsi Snaihne School in Tsi Snaihne (Snye), Quebec.

Mandatory Job Showing is scheduled for June 3rd, 2025 at 2:30 p.m. at the Tsi Snaihne School Parking Lot.

- for all other contractors as a Bid Bond for an amount equal to 10% of the total tender price.

Evaluation of all tenders will follow the Tendering Policy of the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne, which is intended to increase the participation of local and other Aboriginal businesses in construction and materials supply contracting.

Tenders are subject to a formal contract being prepared and executed. The Council reserves the right to reject any or all tenders and the lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
