TENDER FOR CONTRACT 25-3016A – TSISNAIHNE – WATER SERVICE EXTENSION PROJECT – PAUL CREE MEMORIAL ROAD

RFQs, sealed in envelopes and clearly marked as to the contents, will be received by Leslie Papineau, Director, Mohawk Council of Akwesasne Department of Infrastructure and Housing, Administration Building No. 3, Cornwall Island, Ontario K6H 0G5, Telephone (613) 936-1548, until:

4:00 p.m., Local Time, October 2nd, 2025

for the construction of the works described below.

On the same day, commencing at 4:05 pm. local time, the RFQs will be opened and read publicly at the Cornwall Island Administration Office #3 on Cornwall Island.

Project description: The work consists of the supply of all materials, all required equipment, labour and services to extend existing 50mm dia. Water service approx. 340m and provide 25mm dia. service lines to existing homes along the alignment on Paul Cree Memorial Road in Tsi Snaihne, Quebec.

No Mandatory Job Showing is scheduled for this project, if you would like to schedule a site visit, arrangements can be made.

RFQ must be accompanied by a tender deposit payable to the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne as follows:

- for First Nations contractors in the form of a certified cheque, bank draft or money order in the amount of 10% of the total tender price to a maximum of \$20,000
- for all other contractors as a Bid Bond for an amount equal to 10% of the total tender price.

Evaluation of all tenders will follow the Tendering Policy of the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne, which is intended to increase the participation of local and other Aboriginal businesses in construction and materials supply contracting.

RFQs are subject to a formal contract being prepared and executed. The Council reserves the right to reject any or all tenders and the lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
